We are happy to introduce ourselves with you again, and to tell you about all the activities that have been happening in August 2010. The following is a discussion of the major works undertaken during the reporting period and the plan for the next month.

a. THE ACTIVITIES IMPLEMENTED

- 1. Monthly Motivational Meetings: Motivational/Awareness meetings are held during the month, to try to make community people realise their responsibilities at community and their role in the process of family and community development. Four meeting are being conducted in the community, and especial topics include the importance of education, cleanliness, health & hygiene, kitchen/yard gardening, dangers of early marriage, malnutrition, care of cattle's and other issues, vital for the well being of their children etc.
- 2. Guardians' Meetings: During this month one adopted students guardians meeting has arranged in the community. In the meeting, discuss on role of the parents at home, student's attentiveness into the study at school & home. The Guardians have actively participates in the meetings.
- **3. School Visits:** During the month to check the attendance at school of the adopted students, Community Motivator has visited **nine times in four schools**.
- **4. Pre-school:** Community Motivator took **7** classes in pre-school on English, Bangla & Arithmetic beside the regular class routine.
- 5. Community Visits: During the month CM visited 20 times at Jogahati village, 2 times at Churamankati village, 1 times at Lolitadoho village, 1 times at Mohishati village and 2 times at Shorupdah village.
- **6. Door-to-door Visits:** During this month **72** students house has been visits **144 times** for follow-up the students study & family progress such as domestic cattle's care, cleanliness of house & dresses, utilisations of the distributed materials and kitchen gardening etc.
- 7. Tuition Programme: During this month 3-tuition teachers provide special education support to 52 students in a 4-batch. Tuition teachers are giving emphasis to develop scholastic development of the English, Arithmetic and Science subjects which students mostly needs.
- **8. Maria's Visit:** During the month Dr. Maria Martin, representative of IDEA-Onlus visited the BS and the Education for All project activities. Maria brings gifts and supplementary medicine for the adopted students. Also, follow-up the project activities and recommendations for improvements.
 - a) BS0024 Konika: Maria brings dresses and gifts for Konika, which are sent by her adopted family from Italy. We are going to provide financial support to repair the house roof with tin and construct a sanitary latrine. The support will be very precious and valuable for Konika family.
 - **b) BS0044 Shohag:** Maria's mother-in-law sent financial support to the Shohag for purchasing the books and education materials. The supports are very vital for Shohag's education continuation.
 - c) Elderly Beggar Women's: By the generous financial support of Maria's mother-in-law, we provided 20kg Rice, 5kg Dhal, 3kg Potato, 1ltr Soybean Oil, 1kg Salt, 1piece Washing Soap, 1piece Body Soap, 1piece Sari & Lungi to 7 elderly beggars' women and men. The supports bring joy and happiness to this ultra poor people.
 - **d) Health Support:** Maria brought supplementary vitamin tablets for the child and adults. The supplementary vitamin tablet provides extra nourishment to the malnutrition children and adults of the Jogahati. We distributed under 3-12-years age 90 children; below 50years of age 83 women; above 50 years of age 48 men and women.
 - **e) Recommendations:** During the visit in Churamonkati one of listed adopted students BS0087 Joy's family not sending their daughter MONDIRA to school which is very astonishing and against our ethics. So, according discussion with Maria we are planning to enrol Mondira instead of Joy to the project.

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- f) Rezwana Involvement: To manage and accomplish the project day to day secretarial activities and support to Shourove, it has been decided to involve Ms. Rezwana Parvin. Ms. Rezwana Parvin is presently Physiotherapist cum Centre In-charge and full time member of BS. Beside her present job position she will provide volunteer support to project from the September 2010. She will be paid as honorarium from the project.
- 9. Medicine Distribution: During this month in two session we have been distributed the medicine at Jogahati. In one session we distributed anti-worm pills and syrups to the 336 students, parents and villagers of the Jogahati. So, now the total Jogahti peoples are covered by anti-worm campaign. Also, provided the scabies medicine and Maria's supplementary vitamin tablets to the patients.
- **10. School Attendance List:** Now the **73** supported students are studying at **5** different schools, the attendance reports are given below;

- **Summary:** This month 100 percent attendance at school are 58; below 90 to 100 percent attendance at school are 3; below 80 to 90 percent attendance at school are 4; below 80 percent attendance at school are 5.
 - BS0005 Jugal, BS0007 Shushil and BS0008 Monika were totally un-attendant at School. Reason for un-attendants at school is described in point-b no. 1 & 2.
- Due to Ramadan (Muslims fasting month) the schools are closed in 14 August. For that reason schools opens for less days.
- After follow-up and investigation, the most reason to un-attendants at schools is for monsoon fever and relative house visit.
- **11. Distribution Programme:** 30th August we arranged the distribution programme for 73 students.
 - a) Nutrition Materials: We distributed 8kg Rice, 2kg Potato and 1kg Dal (lentil) to the 72 students.
 - **b) Education Materials:** 1piece Copy Books and 1piece Pen to the 52 students. 5 packet chalks provided to pre-school for 48 students.
 - **c) Hygiene Materials**; 1piece Body Soap and 1piece Washing Soap has been given to 72 students.
 - d) Tuition Support: Provided tuition costs to Amlina for the month of August.
 - e) BS Team: In the distribution ceremony Governing Body-Treasurer, Khondaker Moqsudul Haq; General Body- Member, Mohammad Shajahan; Community Motivator, Nazmul Karim; Tuition Teacher- Sufia Khatun, Rexona Khatun & Mina Das was attended the programme and distributed the materials to the students.

b. PROBLEMS AND RECTIFICATIONS

1. After many counselling and motivation BS0005 Jugol not attending in School and with any reason BS0007 Shushil absent in School so, as learning we did not distribute the materials of August to them. Hope they will continue the class again soon.

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- BS0005 Jugol and BS0007 Shushil materials we have been distributed to 4 poor widow women in the Jogahati Community.
- **2.** BS0008 Monika still under the motivation and counselling process. She starts to attend the tuition programme regularly and we hope she will continue again the school.

c. ACTIVITIES ARE PLANNED FOR MONTH OF SEPTEMBER

- 1. **Monthly Awareness & Motivational Meetings** shall conduct at the community. The meetings topic would be kitchen gardening and domestic cattle's rearing.
- **2. Guardians' Meetings** shall arrange with the 72 adopted student parents in a four batch.
- 3. School Visits shall made by CM to follow-up students study and school attendance.
- **4. Community Visits** shall made by CM to follow-up community activities and conduct the development activities. In the month CM shall visit Jogahati 15 times, Churamonkati 2 times, Lolitadoho 1 times, Mohishhati 1 times and Sorupdaho 1 times.
- **5.** Community Motivator shall take 5 classes in **pre-school** and Tuition 10 classes on English, Bangla & Arithmetic beside the regular class routine.
- **6.** Pre-school will arrange 2nd Terminal Examination during the month.
- 7. During the month **door-to-door visit** shall continue to adopted student houses for follow-up the study at home, to solve the family issues, to check domestic cattle's, to see cleanliness, to ensure utilisation of the distributed materials and support to implementation of kitchen gardening's.
- **8.** Binoy and BS0024 Konika house shall repair during this month by the financial support of Konika's Italian parents.
- **9.** Community motivator shall visit the **waiting list** students to follow-up at school and home.
- **10.** We are planning to arrange the next **distribution** programme at 27th September.
- **11.** Plan to prepare the Child profile of the new students from the new community.
- **12.** We are waiting for the approval of the "**PRERONA**" project from the NGO bureau for next 3-years.
